ABOUT SCRIBUS

Scribus is an Open Source, cross-platform desktop publishing (DTP) program.

Originally developed on Linux, Scribus also runs natively on current versions of Mac OS X 10.5 or later, OS/2 Warp 4/eComStation, Windows 2000 or later, and modern UNIX systems. The goal of the *Scribus Team* is to enable beginners to create professional-grade page layout and output, without limiting the advanced requirements of professional designers.


Since its humble beginning in the spring of 2001, Scribus has evolved into one of the premier Open Source desktop applications. Encouraged by professionals and beginners alike, the *Scribus Team*, supported by a large and constantly growing number of enthusiastic contributors from all over the world, is dedicated to develop and improve "one of the most powerful and useful open-source projects out there" (TechRepublic).

Underneath a user-friendly interface, Scribus supports many professional publishing features, such as CMYK colors, spot color support, ICC color management and versatile PDF creation, including PDF/X.

Scribus has many rather unexpected touches, such as powerful vector drawing tools, support for a huge number of file types via import/export filters, emulation of color blindness or the rendering of markup languages like LaTeX or Lilypond inside Scribus.

The Scribus file format is XML-based and open. Unlike proprietary binary file formats, even damaged documents can be recovered with a simple text editor – sometimes a challenging problem with other page layout programs.

Scribus is available in more than 20 languages, and the language of the user interface can be switched without restarting the program.
